Highlights Indonesia's trade with G-15 countries is around 10% of its global trade. Its biggest trading partner in the G-15 is Malaysia. Indonesia has a trade surplus with G-15 countries taken together as well as a global trade surplus. Indonesia's exports to Mexico and Peru registered a jump in 2006. Imports from Malaysia and Argentina have risen sharply since 2004. In 2006, Indonesia's top 5 export destinations were Japan, Singapore, the US, China and South Korea. In 2006, Indonesia's top 5 import sources were Singapore, China, Japan, South Korea and Malaysia. Between 2000-2006, Indonesia's exports to G-15 countries as a percentage of its global exports increased from 7.5% to 10.2%. Between 2000-2006, Indonesia's imports from G-15 countries as a percentage of its global imports increased from 8.2% to 9.1%.
